

English–Hebrew Law Integration Program



About the program

The first year is taught in English and includes three core legal courses: Criminal Law, Constitutional Law, and Administrative Law, together with Introduction to Legal Thought and Writing (Assisted Hebrew). Students also attend Hebrew Ulpan according to their Hebrew proficiency level.

The second year marks the transition to the regular Hebrew LL.B. curriculum, with continued academic support.

During the third and fourth year, students continue their studies in the regular Hebrew LL.B. curriculum alongside Israeli students, completing the remaining mandatory courses and elective requirements.

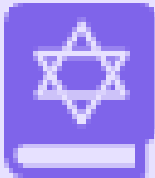
