

English–Hebrew Law Integration Program



About the program

The first year is taught in English and includes Hebrew ulpan (according to each student's proficiency level) and a Legal Hebrew course, alongside three core legal courses: Criminal Law, Constitutional Law, and Administrative Law.

The second year is an integrative year. Students will join the regular Hebrew-language curriculum with ongoing academic support.

The third and fourth year, all courses are taken in Hebrew alongside Israeli students.

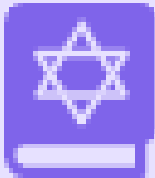
